Competition: Stand on one leg

Stand on one leg for a minute; when you think the minute is up then you can sit down. Time seems to pass slowly when you are waiting for something – even if it is only to put your foot down! When people were waiting for the Messiah/saviour/Jesus to be born time seemed to pass slowly – but God kept his promise! Play with the people at home by setting a timer and standing on one one leg until you think 1 minute has passed. See who is the closest in their estimation. Now have a second competition – who can stay on one leg for longest? God always keeps his promises, even if it seems a long time to wait for the answers.

Game: Christmas charades

Act out things surrounding Christmas for other people to guess. The person who guesses correctly gets to think of their own thing to act out relating to Christmas to act out for everyone-keep going until time to finish the game. Decorating the Christmas tree // Cutting the Christmas turkey // Snowball fight // Father Christmas coming down the chimney // Ice skating // Carolling // Baby Jesus // Making snow angels // Wrapping presents or opening presents // Reindeer pulling slay // Father Christmas coming down the chimney

Story: The Promised Messiah
